

The following steps are being taken to ensure camper and staff safety during this time:

- All staff will be required to wear masks at all time.
- Campers will be required to wear masks unless eating or engaged in high energy aerobic activities that would make wearing a mask not feasible.
- Frequent handwashing will be recommended, and sanitizer will be made available to all campers and staff.
- Camp will be limited to 45 campers and social distancing will be practiced at all time.
- The meal plan and snack programs are being discontinued, campers will pack their own lunch, snacks, and water bottles.
- When eating campers will sit at separate tables, facing the same direction as consistent with the CDC guidelines.
- Each camper will be given a drawstring bag or "Camp Kit" that will contain a mask and some basic arts and craft supplies. Kits will be stored separately and will be taken home each night to avoid cross contamination. This will also help limit the sharing of supplies.
- An additional staff person will be assigned to each camp. This staff person does not have child supervision responsibilities but rather is responsible for the sanitation and disinfection of all common surfaces throughout the day. Sanitation will be performed according to the CDC guidelines.
- Activities will be modified to restrict the number of participants to help ensure social distancing. Example: groups of 15 will use the playground with equipment being sanitized in between groups rather than the whole camp of 45 utilizing the playground at the same time.
- Signage will be posted reminding campers and staff of measures to help stop the spread and reduce the risk of contracting COVID-19.
- A trained staff member will be monitoring campers and staff for signs of illness and will take the actions consistent with the CDC guidelines in the event of a sick camper or staff member.
- Any staff member that feels ill will be encouraged to stay home until they are feeling better and are symptom free.
