### **MANAGER'S MESSAGE:**

As we look ahead to the coming year, residents can expect to see more progress on planning for our community center, the continuation of our sustainability efforts, and improvements to walkability.

The community center, which was made possible by a very generous \$10 million donation, remains in its planning phase. Consultants spent the second half of 2023 listening to residents, stakeholders, and potential user groups, as planning began. This year we will shift from the information gathering phase to finalizing site selection and creating architectural plans and renderings.

The Township continued with numerous green initiatives last year and looks to build on that momentum moving forward. In 2023, a solar-powered electric vehicle charging station that provides two chargers for electric vehicles was installed in the parking lot near the Public Works garage on the Township Building Campus. The station, which is completely powered by solar energy, is intended to provide for daily range replacement (DRR), essentially topping off the charge of an electric vehicle. Last year the Township completed a two-year project to convert all parking lot lighting at Wentz Run Park and at the Township Building Campus to solar. A grant of nearly \$125,000 paid for much of the project.

In 2023, Whitpain was fortunate to receive two grants for the area near the intersection of Jolly and Wentz Roads. The grants will fund improvements to the intersection of Jolly and Wentz Roads, with the installation of a right-turn lane from westbound Jolly Road onto Wentz Road and additional sidewalk installation along Wentz Road from Jolly Road to Horseshoe Drive. The grants were awarded by the Montgomery County Commissioners and by Pennsylvania's Green Light Go program.

ocal government of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is divided into a number of classifications i.e., cities, townships, and boroughs. There are two categories of townships in the Commonwealth - those identified as townships of the first class and those known as townships of the second class. Second class townships make up the greatest bulk of municipalities in Pennsylvania. Whitpain Township is a Township of the Second Class. It is governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors elected at large by the electorate. Most, if not all, of the executive and legislative powers allocated to Whitpain Township in the State Second Class Township Code are vested in the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors is empowered to appoint professionals to assist them in the operation of the Township and to furnish advice and counsel on technical matters. Additionally, the Board appoints all of the members of the various advisory boards and commissions as well as the Zoning Hearing Board and the Planning Commission.

The levying of Township taxes and the appropriations to the various departments and subsidiary boards and commissions are the responsibility of the Board of Supervisors. During the months of November and December, public hearings are held for the purpose of reviewing the budget for the following year. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings and to review the proposed Township budget during that time.

### **Board Of Supervisors Reorganizes**

The Board of Supervisors held its annual reorganization meeting on Tuesday, January 2. The meeting began with newly elected Supervisor Sara Selverian taking the oath of office along with Elected Auditor Jessica Brunner.

At the meeting, Supervisor Scott Badami was elected chair, Supervisor Kim Koch was elected vice-chair, Supervisor Jeff Campolongo will serve as secretary, Supervisor Joyce Keller as treasurer, and Supervisor Sara Selverian as assistant secretary.

"I'd like to express my sincere appreciation to my colleagues for electing me to serve as the Chair once again for 2024," said Scott Badami. "I very much look forward to continuing to work with my fellow Supervisors, Mr. Pronczak, Mr. Mrochko, Chief Lawson and Whitpain's fine staff as we continue to try to make a difference here in Whitpain Township."



### **SUPERVISORS APPROVE 2024 BUDGET**

Supervisors unanimously adopted the 2024 budget at their regularly scheduled meeting on December 19. The budget keeps tax rates steady at 3.2 mills.

The budget includes funding for improvements at Mermaid and Wissahickon Parks, the continued renovations and expansion of the Public Works garage, and improvements to traffic signals.

A \$5 per month increase to residential sewer rates was also approved at the meeting, along with a corresponding increase to commercial rates. The increase will begin in the second quarter of 2024.

Sewer rates were last increased five years ago. A variety of issues contributed to the need for a rate change including increases in treatment costs and increases in vehicle and equipment prices.





### **Deputy Chief Retires**

The Board of Supervisors and the Police Department joined together in early December to celebrate the career of Deputy Police Chief William Armstrong who retired at the end of the year. Originally hired in 1988, Bill served in nearly every position in the department including patrol officer, traffic officer, patrol sergeant, detective sergeant, lieutenant, and ultimately deputy chief.

"Bill has been an instrumental leader in our department and in our community for parts of five decades," said Police Chief Ken Lawson. "His calm demeanor, comprehensive knowledge, and consummate professionalism will be missed, but his legacy will live on in the numerous officers he mentored over the years."



### **Supervisor Michele Minnick Honored For Service**

Retiring Supervisor Michele Minnick was recognized at the Board of Supervisors' meeting on December 19.

"Over the last six years, Michele helped lead our Township with compassion, calmness, and a steadfast dedication to our residents," said Board Chair Scott Badami. "Michele got into local government for all the right reasons. While my fellow Supervisors and I will miss her voice on our Board, we are pleased she will still be just down the street in Whitpain where we can still seek her wise counsel."

Michele was initially sworn in as a Supervisor in January 2018 and served on numerous subcommittees while guiding the Township as Board Chair in 2020 and in 2021.



Over the course of her service to the Township, Michele's hard work led to numerous accomplishments including the acquisition of Mermaid Park, continued historic preservation, and continued work on improving walkability. She accomplished all of this while leading the Township during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Along with free trees, free mulch and deer protection will be distributed to Township residents on a first-come, first-served basis.


This is a one-day event and will take place rain or shine. There is a limit of one group of three trees per address or household.

No pre-registration is required but homeowners must present identification indicating Whitpain resident status.



# Stormwater Management

Homeowners can take steps to help reduce the effects of stormwater runoff in their communities. By doing their part, homeowners can help reduce the speed and amount of runoff, which helps keep local creeks and waterways healthy for years to come. Help preserve the health and beauty of the streams and creeks of Whitpain Township by using some of the stormwater management tips listed below!



Rainfall flows down rooftops into gutters and downspouts, then gushes down driveways to flow into the street and storm drains. To slow water down (and save money on water bills), consider a rain barrel. Place the barrel under a downspout, then capture the water for the lawn or garden. Learn more about different types of rain barrels by visiting the Whitpain Township stormwater management link below!

The large amount of impervious cover can be a significant contribution to excessive stormwater runoff. Consider reducing the amount of impervious surface on a property with driveways or parking areas built from porous asphalt or special concrete blocks containing holes to allow rainfall to trickle through. Or try a patio made from loose slate with gravel between rocks.

A close-cropped, well-manicured lawn may look attractive, but it allows stormwater to flow across it too quickly. Maintaining grass at a height of at least four inches slows the growth of weeds while better absorbing stormwater.

A rain garden is a planted shallow depression designated to catch and filter rainfall runoff. The garden captures rain from a downspout or a driveway. The water sinks into the ground, aided by deep rooted plants that like wet and dry conditions. Rain gardens have been proven to help slow down stormwater runoff and filter pollution, protect rivers and streams, and create a healthy habitat for birds and butterflies.


