MANAGER'S MESSAGE:

2025 promises to be a year where we see big progress on some long-standing projects in the Township. Wissahickon Park, in our West Ambler neighborhood, is slated to be under construction this year. After securing over \$2 million in state and federal grants for the project, the site will be transformed into a park featuring a walking path, playing courts, a pavilion, playgrounds, and more.

PennDOT is also making progress on the long-awaited 202 Widening Project.

Most of the remaining work is in the vicinity of the intersection of Routes 202 and 73. PennDOT anticipates work will be completed in the fall of 2025. The end product will yield two northbound lanes, two southbound lanes, a center turn lane, bike lanes on both sides of the roadway, and sidewalks on at least one side of the roadway.

This issue of the Township's newsletter has more information about Park and Recreations Programs, special events like our annual Shade Tree giveaway and updates on other projects, like the creation of pickleball courts at Wentz Run Park. As part of this project, Township tennis facilities will relocate to upgraded courts at the Montgomery County Community College campus later this year to make room for 12 pickleball courts at Wentz Run Park.

ocal government of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is divided into a number of classifications i.e., cities, townships, and boroughs. There are two categories of townships in the Commonwealth - those identified as townships of the first class and those known as townships of the second class. Second class townships make up the greatest bulk of municipalities in Pennsylvania. Whitpain Township is a Township of the Second Class. It is governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors elected at large by the electorate. Most, if not all, of the executive and legislative powers allocated to Whitpain Township in the State Second Class Township Code are vested in the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors is empowered to appoint professionals to assist them in the operation of the Township and to furnish advice and counsel on technical matters. Additionally, the Board appoints all of the members of the various advisory boards and commissions as well as the Zoning Hearing Board and the Planning Commission.

The levying of Township taxes and the appropriations to the various departments and subsidiary boards and commissions are the responsibility of the Board of Supervisors. During the months of November and December, public hearings are held for the purpose of reviewing the budget for the following year. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings and to review the proposed Township budget during that time.

Whitpain Receives Over \$3 Million in Grants



This fall, the Township was awarded two state grants totaling over \$3 million.

The first grant received was for \$1,463,300 for the installation of a traffic signal and other intersection improvements at Skippack Pike and School Road. The Township anticipates a match of \$450,000 for this project. Although the completion of the project is still a few years away, the Township is currently going through the right-of-way acquisition process for this grant while also working on the design phase.

The Township was also awarded a \$1.7 million grant from the state to help fund the construction of a community center. With the initial donation of \$10 million, associated interest on this money, and the state grant, the Township will have approximately \$13 million to build a community center.

Board Approves 2025 Budget

The Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the Township's 2025 budget in December.

The budget contains funding for improvements at Mermaid and Wissahickon parks, traffic improvements such as the signalization of the intersection of Skippack Pike and School Road, and continued walkability improvements.

The budget includes .75 mill tax increase, the first in the Township since 2010. The adjustment was needed to account for cost increases over the last 14 years, a decline in the total assessed value of properties in Whitpain due to appeals from commercial property owners and declines in earned income, real estate transfer and local services tax revenues.

The millage change means a resident with a home assessed at the average value in the Township will pay \$14 more a month in real estate taxes in 2025.



Shade Tree Commission Initiatives

The Shade Tree Commission is continuing to lead green initiatives throughout the Township. Last year marked the 29th consecutive year the Township was recognized with the coveted "Tree City USA" designation by the National Arbor Day Foundation. Additionally, Whitpain is the longest-running recipient in the entire state of the National Arbor Day Foundation's prestigious "Growth Award."

FREE Street Tree Program

The Free Street Tree Program promotes the establishment of new street trees which will benefit our community for generations and increase property values.

Through this program a limited number of residents can receive a free, professionally planted street tree on their property.

ARBOR DAY NATIVE TREE GIVEAWAY

The Annual Township Arbor Day Beautification Program is set for Sunday, April 27 at 8 a.m. at Prophecy Creek Park. Once again, the giveaway features a wide range of native species. Along with free trees, free mulch and deer protection will be distributed to Township residents on a first-come, first-served basis.

This is a one-day event and will take place rain or shine. There is a limit of one group of three trees per address or household. No pre-registration is required but homeowners must present identification indicating Whitpain resident status.

Single Use Plastic Bag Ordinance

Looking toward a more sustainable future, the Whitpain Township Board of Supervisors recently passed an ordinance to regulate and minimize single-use plastic bags, utensils, and expanded polystyrene (AKA Styrofoam). By promoting the use of reusable alternatives, the Township aims to curb litter in our community, protect local waterways, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and reduce solid waste generation.

Beginning in November of 2025, retail establishments will no longer provide single-use plastic bags or polystyrene containers to customers. However, retail establishments may provide customers with recyclable paper bags for a charge of

not less than \$0.15 per bag. Additionally, plastic utensils will only be available upon request from a customer.

To help raise awareness, retail establishments will be required to post signage announcing the regulation in the Spring of 2025. Beginning in early 2025, Township staff along with members of the Whitpain Environmental Advisory Council will work with retail establishments to make them aware of the new regulations.

Fire Safety Tips

Whitpain's Fire Marshal's office has added a fire safety tips area to the Township website at www.whitpaintownship.org. From electric bike safety to grilling safety and many topics in between, the improved section of the website contains a wealth of information. Perhaps the most important tip of all centers around the proper installation and care of smoke alarms.

In a typical home fire, occupants have just minutes to escape. And because smoke in one area may not reach a smoke alarm in another, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recommends placement of at least one smoke alarm on every level of the home (including basements), in every bedroom, and outside each sleeping The NFPA also recommends interconnection of alarms to provide better whole-home protection than standalone alarms. Leading authorities recommend that both ionization and photoelectric smoke alarms be installed to help ensure maximum detection of the various types of fires that can occur within the home.

The NFPA also recommends CO alarms be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms throughout the home.

Bus Patrol Launches To Help Protect Students



The Wissahickon School District, in partnership with the Whitpain, Ambler and Lower Gwynedd police departments, has launched "Bus Patrol" to protect students riding on school buses.

The program involves cameras placed on all school buses to detect the license plates of vehicles that fail to stop for the buses, putting children at risk.

The video evidence is then shared with the police departments for review before a notice of violation is issued. First time violations are \$300. In the first two and a half months, Whitpain Township alone has approved over 500 violations for vehicles failing to stop for school buses with their red flashing lights activated and stop arm extended.
