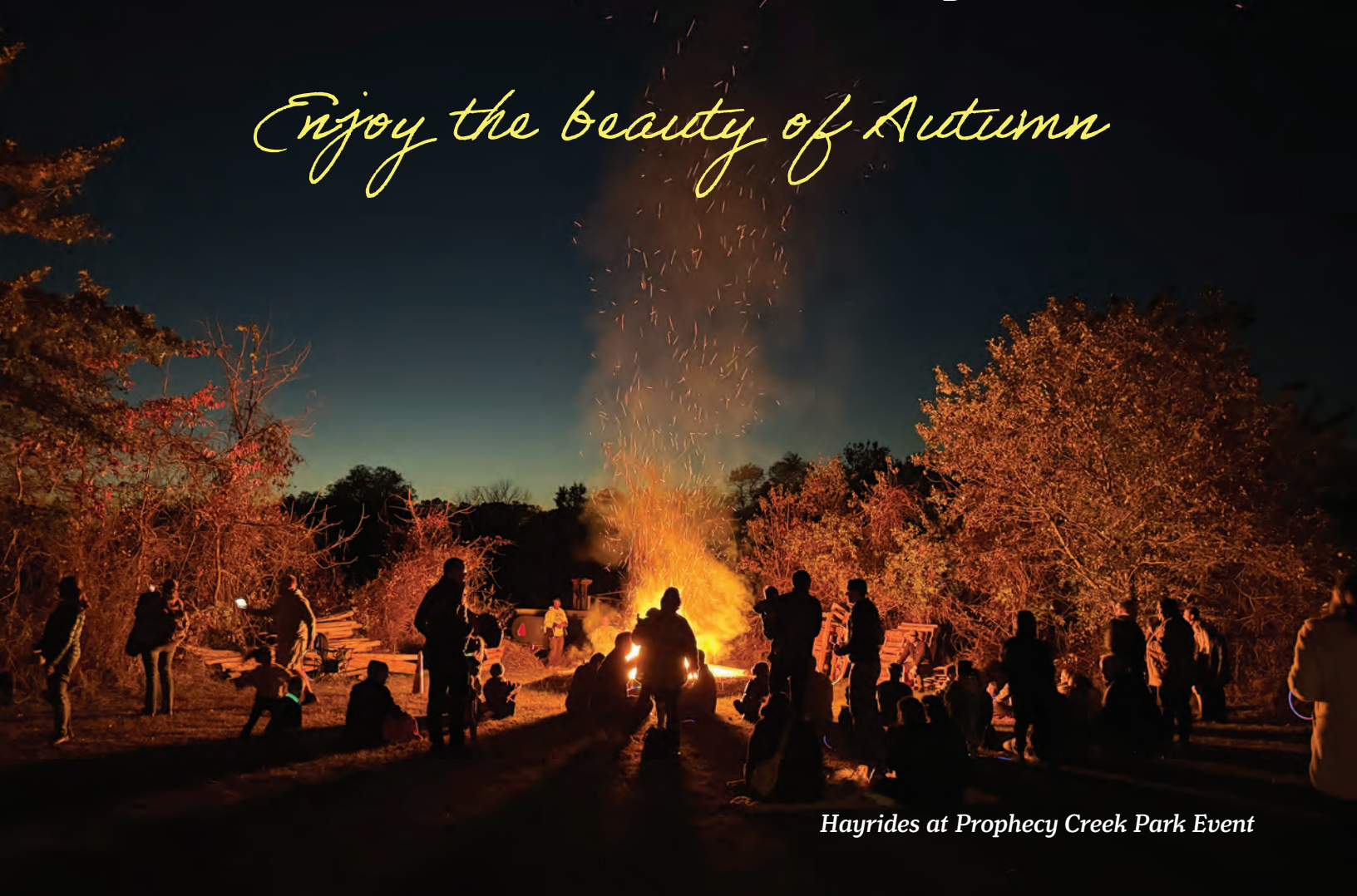

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Manager's Message:



From pickleball to playgrounds, the last 12 months in Whitpain have been marked by the improvement and expansion of our park offerings. New park amenities began opening last fall when new pickleball courts were unveiled at Wentz Run Park, followed closely by the opening of our new dog park and inclusive playground at Mermaid Park. However, the more major improvements really kicked into gear in 2026.

Wissahickon Park opened this summer and features two age-appropriate playgrounds, basketball courts, a grass volleyball court, a walking trail, and additional parking. The park was an active Township park in the West Ambler community for decades before it closed in 1984 due to asbestos contamination. After years of remediation by federal regulators, significant grant awards by the federal and state government totaling well over \$2 million, and a sizable contribution from the Township's budget totaling well over \$1 million, the reimagined park was finally able to reopen.

Work also continues on the biggest public project in Township history with the construction of the Whitpain Community Center. Construction commenced in the spring of 2026 and is expected to be completed in mid-2027.

Local government of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is divided into a number of classifications i.e., cities, townships, and boroughs. There are two categories of townships in the Commonwealth – those identified as townships of the first class and those known as townships of the second class. Second class townships make up the greatest bulk of municipalities in Pennsylvania. Whitpain Township is a Township of the Second Class. It is governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors elected at large by the electorate. Most, if not all, of the executive and legislative powers allocated to Whitpain Township in the State Second Class Township Code are vested in the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors is empowered to appoint professionals to assist them in the operation of the Township and to furnish advice and counsel on technical matters. Additionally, the Board appoints all of the members of the various advisory boards and commissions as well as the Zoning Hearing Board and the Planning Commission.

The levying of Township taxes and the appropriations to the various departments and subsidiary boards and commissions are the responsibility of the Board of Supervisors. During the months of November and December, public hearings are held for the purpose of reviewing the budget for the following year. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings and to review the proposed Township budget during that time.

Township Receives Grant for Mermaid Park Trail



The Township has been awarded a \$1 million grant for the design and construction of the Mermaid Park Connector Pedestrian Trail.

The 5-foot-wide concrete trail will be constructed along portions of Jolly Road and Arch Street Road. It will improve pedestrian mobility by providing pedestrian connections within Mermaid Park as well as painted crosswalks and traffic controls.

“Since the Township purchased Mermaid Park, we have been looking for ways to expand pedestrian access to the park from surrounding neighborhoods,” said Township Engineer Jim Blanch. “In late 2025, the Township completed a project to upgrade pedestrian access at the intersection of Wentz and Jolly Roads, but this grant allows us to make even bigger pedestrian improvements in and around Mermaid Park.”

The grant comes from the 2025 Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA) of the Federal Highway Administration’s (FHWA) Surface Block Grant Program.

The federal Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA) provides funding for projects and activities defined as transportation alternatives, including on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, infrastructure projects for improving non-driver access to public transportation and enhanced mobility, community improvement activities, environmental mitigation, trails that serve a transportation purpose, and safe routes to school projects.

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Community Center Construction



Construction is in full swing at the future Whitpain Community Center. The Board of Supervisors gathered with state elected officials and members of the Parks and Open Space Board to celebrate a ceremonial groundbreaking for the project on Friday, April 24.

Funded by a \$10 million donation, and two state grants totaling \$1.8 million, the new center will be adjacent to Centre Square Park at the intersection of Route 202 and Jolly Road, where the former Dog Park was located.

The center will be transformational for the community with indoor spaces available for year-round meetings, police and fire fighter training, youth sports, adult leagues, and senior activities, as well as private events.

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Chief Lawson Retiring



After a remarkable career spanning more than forty years in law enforcement, **Whitpain Township Police Chief Ken Lawson** announced his retirement for this fall. Having served as Chief since May 2015, Lawson concludes his tenure as one of the longest-serving police officers in Whitpain's history. This milestone marks the culmination of decades of hard work, perseverance, and unwavering dedication to public safety.

Chief Lawson's journey in law enforcement began after he graduated from West Chester University with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. With a clear vision of becoming a police officer, he joined the Whitpain Township Police Department in 1985. Over the next thirty years, Lawson steadily advanced through the ranks, gaining vital experience in nearly every facet of the department. He began as a patrol officer, then earned promotions to sergeant, patrol lieutenant, deputy chief, and ultimately Chief of Police. Lawson reflected that when he was initially hired in 1985, he never imagined he would one day lead the department. He credits the support of his friends, family, fellow officers, and many elected and appointed officials over the years for helping his responsibilities grow as he gained valuable experience.

Throughout his distinguished career, Chief Lawson has been repeatedly recognized for his leadership and deep dedication to the profession. His accolades include graduating from the prestigious F.B.I. National Academy, serving as President of the Montgomery County Police Chiefs' Association, being named Police Officer of the Year by the Wissahickon Chamber of Commerce, and receiving numerous internal police commendations.

While his personal accomplishments are vast, Chief Lawson has always maintained that his proudest achievements are the tangible improvements to the department and the Whitpain community. Notably, he helped guide the department to achieve its initial Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Commission Accreditation in 2014, a premier distinction the department proudly maintains to this day. As Chief, Lawson transformed the department by championing the principles of community-based, 21st-century policing, ensuring that the agency remained progressive, transparent, and deeply connected to the people it protects.

For more than forty years, Chief Lawson's primary focus has been the residents and business owners of Whitpain Township. By building strong, collaborative partnerships, he built bridges that benefited the entire community, always calling it an absolute honor to serve such an outstanding township. As he prepares to hand over the watch, Chief Lawson extended a special message of gratitude to the men and women of the police department, describing them as exceptional people who show up every day with pride and dedication to keep the Whitpain community safe. The entire township joins together to thank Chief Ken Lawson for a lifetime of exemplary service and to wish him and his family the very best in a well-deserved retirement.



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Deer Management Program Expanding



Heading into its fourth year, the Township's deer management program is expanding this year based on resident feedback and input from various citizen boards and commissions. As in previous years, only approved archery hunters, who hold a valid hunting license from the state and who have been vetted by the Township, can participate in the program.

The Township-owned properties where hunting is permitted are expanding to include sections of Prophecy Creek Park and the Wurtz Tract off Penllyn Blue Bell Pike. Township-owned sections of the Armentrout Preserve will continue to be included in the program.

Hunting will be permitted on nearly all legal Pennsylvania archery hunting dates in the fall and early winter. These dates run from September 19 to November 27 and again from December 26 to January 24. Hunters are most active around dawn and dusk, so the parks indicated above will be closed on weekends from dawn until 10 a.m. and from 2 p.m. until dusk. On weekdays, park users will have access to parks throughout regular park hours and are encouraged to wear brightly colored clothing.

All visitors must follow Township rules and ordinances when using parks and open spaces. This includes making sure dogs are on leashes.

Home Fire Safety Tips

Each year, countless families in America experience the devastating effects of home fires, but many of these tragedies can be prevented with simple precautions and awareness. With working smoke detectors, residents have two minutes to evacuate their homes from the time of alarm activation. Fire doubles in size every 30 seconds with today's combustible materials!



Help protect your home and loved ones with these safety tips:

- **Install Smoke Alarms:** Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, especially outside sleeping areas. Every bedroom should have a smoke detector in them! Test them monthly and replace batteries at least once a year if they are not 10-year Lithium-Ion.
- **Create an Escape Plan:** Develop a fire escape plan with your family. Identify two ways out of every room and designate a meeting place outside. Practice your plan regularly.
- **Kitchen Safety:** Stay attentive while cooking. Keep flammable items away from the stove and never leave cooking unattended.
- **Electrical Safety:** Inspect cords and plugs for damage. Avoid overloading outlets and use appliances according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- **Heating Equipment:** Keep flammable materials away from heaters and fireplaces. Have your heating system inspected annually.
- **Fire Extinguishers:** Keep a fire extinguisher in key areas of your home, such as the kitchen and garage, and learn how to use it.
- **Educate Your Family:** Teach children about fire safety, including what to do in case of a fire and the importance of staying low to the ground to avoid smoke. "STAY LOW AND GO!"

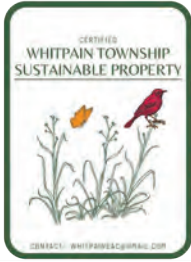

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Stormwater Pollution Prevention Tips

Melting Snow Is Stormwater Too!

Stormwater runoff can come in many forms, including snow melt! When the ground is frozen, melting snow can't infiltrate into the soil the way a light or moderate rain would be able to. This means that even a small amount of snow can cause flooding issues on your property.

When snow melts, it picks up all kinds of debris and pollutants that will make their way to nearby streams and creeks.

Check out some steps that you can take to prevent stormwater pollution this winter:

- ♦ **Start shoveling early!** The more snow you remove, the less salt and sand you'll need.
- ♦ **Pile snow in locations with the most opportunity for it to infiltrate into the ground.**
- ♦ **Use deicing salt sparingly.** Follow product instructions and give it time to work. Sweep up any remaining material.
- ♦ **Clear away any snow that may have been thrown onto the storm drains.**
- ♦ **Salt is not effective once temperatures hit 15 degrees Fahrenheit or below.** Consider using traction materials that contain acetate, potassium chloride, magnesium chloride, or cracked cornmeal.

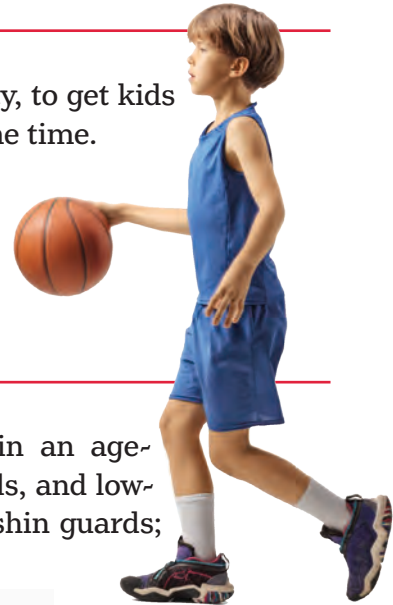

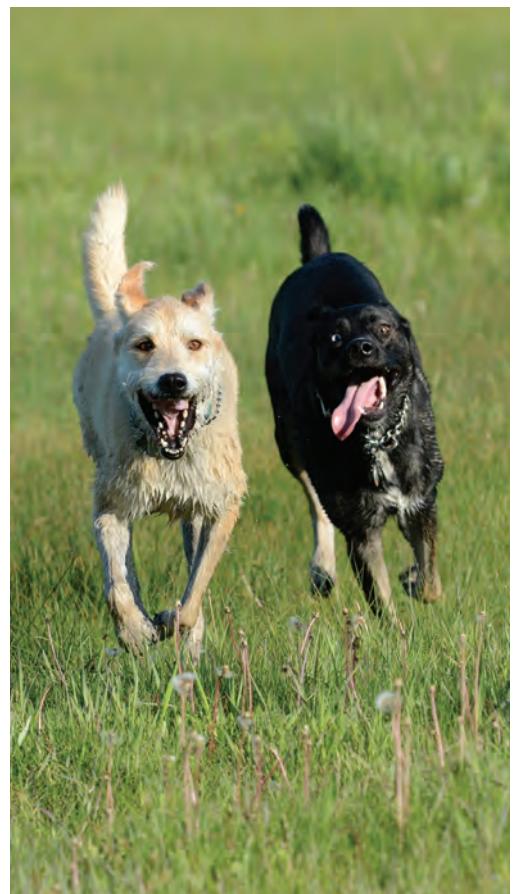
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
